Survey of social workers in Lancashire to highlight recruitment and retention difficulties and issues of stress, overwork and service quality problems. Resulted in partnership working between trade unions and management to resolve the issues.

Three studies and surveys for RAGE, Birmingham

For Residents Action Group for the Elderly (RAGE).

Studies examined the community and employment impact of the proposed closure and transfer of care homes. Other work has included economic and social audits in Northern Ireland, analysis of the Private Finance Initiative in health, and proposals for support services in Portsmouth NHS Trust and Pinderfields NHS Trust.

Sustainable Development and the Health and Social Care Economy

A significant contribution to policy and practice on how sustainable development can be mainstreamed in the health and social care economy. The report provides a sustainable development framework for health and social care together with methods of mainstreaming sustainable development into investment, employment and procurement policies and strategies to reduce health inequalities. It identifies opportunities and barriers and discusses the limitations of corporate social responsibility and corporate citizen approaches.
